*Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil. (Genesis 3:22)*

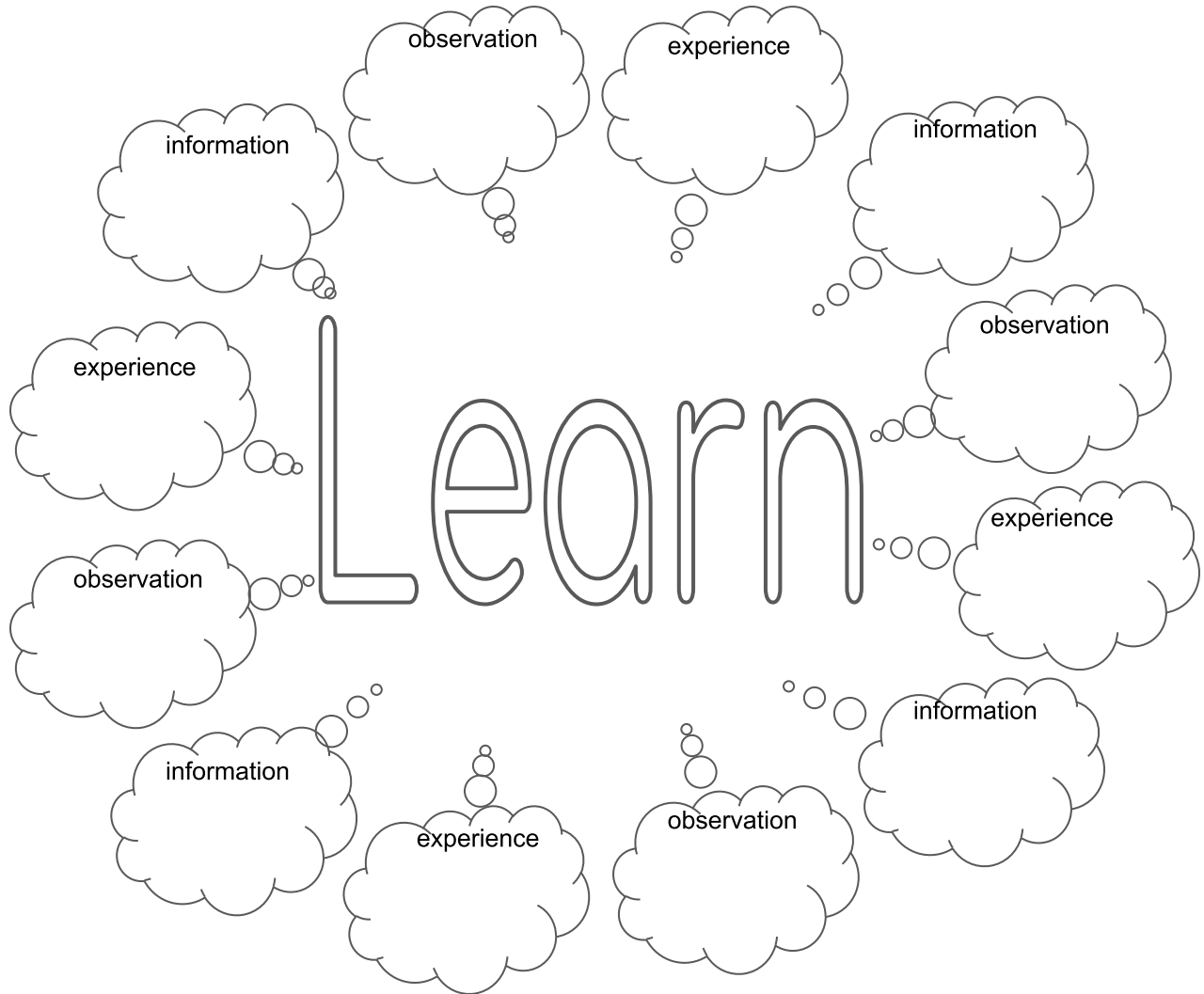
