Acts 15:40–41; 16:22–25	Moses & Aaron	1 Kings 19:19–21; 2 Kings 2:1–15	Ruth chose to remain with Naomi and embraced Naomi's God as her own, declaring, "thy God my God."
Ruth & Naomi	Elisha left his former life to follow Elijah and serve God. Their relationship developed around devotion to God's prophetic work.	Aquila & Priscilla	1 Samuel 18:1–4; 20:12–17
