Corrections to the New International Version of the English New Testament

The New International Version generally achieves the clarity and literary grace it attempted, and mostly without substantitive sacrifice in accuracy. However, no product of man is above correction, whether unintentionally or due to ingrained biases. E.g., the NIV preface says, "The Committee on Bible Translation... were from many denominations – including Anglican, Assemblies of God, Baptist, Brethren, Christian Reformed, Church of Christ, Evangelical Free, Lutheran, Mennonite, Methodist, Nazarene, Presbyterian, Weslyan and other churches." The introduction to *The NIV Study Bible* adds, "Doctrinally, the Study Bible reflects traditional evangelical theology." This latter may be understood to mean, 'If the words of the Lord and the apostles differ from traditional evangelical theology, the translation and comments will cover it up.' It should be the desire of the sincere reader not to find a translation which justifies his personal preferences, but one which reflects what the Lord and the apostles said; so that he may change himself according to that word. Therefore, a preliminary list of corrections to the NIV text is begun here as an aid to the serious Bible student.

Overall Observations on the NIV New Testament

The best translations, whether of the Bible or of any other work, will be those which fully retain the meaning – keeping precision where the original is precise, and preserving ambiguities where the original allows more than one interpretation. When the translator must add words (e.g., a Greek sentence without a verb should be translated into English with a verb, but the tense should be ambiguous), those words should be so indicated – by custom, with fine-line italics. The meanings of words should not be changed, though footnotes may be needed to express ambiguity (e.g., Greek has only one word to express both covenant and testament; Greek and Hebrew each have a word meaning breath, wind, and spirit).

The NIV is relatively easy reading. It is somewhat above average for accuracy, though it is no match for Rotherham, NASB and ASV, or a majority of diaglotts (Marshall, Concordant, Kingdom Interlinear, Douglas, and Wilson).

There is no indication in the NIV when words are added in translation, unlike the AV, RV, ASV and NASB, which italicize. In Matthew the NIV stresses doom in English more than the gospel writer does in the Greek, while failing to distinguish between hades and gehenna. In John it persistently translates the neuter references to the Holy Spirit as masculine, while awkwardly shying away from the expression "only begotten." In Paul's epistles, NIV strangely tries to translate "sarks" (flesh) as "sinful nature," but cannot do so consistently (e.g., references to Jesus in Ro 1:3, 1Tm 3:16, and in 1Pt 3:18, 4:1). Similarly, throughout the epistles every effort is made to consistently translate "parousia" (presence) as "come" or "coming," though it necessarily breaks down in 2Co 10:10 and Php 1:26, and especially in Php 2:12. A related technical inaccuracy is translating "prosopon" (face, *implying favor*) as "presence." In Revelation, NIV translates references to the works by which people are to be judged with past tense ("what he has done"), whether the verb is present tense or there is no verb at all. Noting the necessary corrections, the NIV New Testament can be a useful translation, although for serious study and Christian application there are translations requiring fewer corrections.
